READ: Nehemiah 2: 11-20

TALK ABOUT:

Nehemiah inspected the damaged walls of Jerusalem and set out to rebuild them. What was the most favorite thing that you ever built as a child? Did it have to be taken apart, and was that sad? For us today, let's think of how each one of us can "rebuild" ourselves. Maybe we have had set backs or difficult times recently and wonder what our future holds. Do you think these thoughts went through Nehemiah's mind?

Take a few minutes to think about the recent past and events that took place where you were overwhelmed and thinking that the task of recovery was too great. Share how the stories of Nehemiah and Martin Luther might inspire you to overcome these obstacles.
